The other major reasons for the ABC decision to support the GCWSR campaign is that we feel that the Gold Coast was marketed in the early seventies for it's climate and beautiful beaches and as time progressed for having some of the worlds most iconic surf breaks. The Gold Coasts world class surf breaks bring in countless amounts of money and employment to the local economy and in simple terms it is our beach culture and natural resources that attract so many people to both visit and strive to live here.
